
















## Key roles of a guide

- Leadership and Safety: Guides lead groups through a location, ensuring everyone stays together and follows the planned itinerary. They are also responsible for the group's safety, providing practical assistance, and responding to any emergencies.
- Information and Storytelling: They provide commentary on the sites being visited, explaining historical facts, cultural insights, and interesting anecdotes. Guides make abstract concepts or a series of ruins understandable by giving them context.
- Logistical Support: Guides often handle practical aspects of a trip, such as checking visitors in, managing tickets and fees, coordinating with accommodation providers, and handling baggage.
- Enhancing the Experience: Guides aim to make the experience memorable by connecting people to the local environment, traditions, and history in an engaging way.
   They may also act as interpreters, translating and communicating for visitors who speak a different language.
- Facilitating Learning and Curiosity: In educational settings, a guide's role is to spark curiosity rather than simply lecturing. They might ask powerful questions, share inspiring stories, and co-create learning experiences with participants to foster ownership and engagement.
